

ORDER

On November 15, 2013, the appellant filed a notice of appeal from his conviction and sentence imposed on July 9, 2013. The proof of service shows that the appellant served the notice of appeal on the State on November 12, 2013. Pursuant to Rule 203(b)(2) of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR), a notice of appeal shall be served on all respondents within ten days after the sentence is imposed. The appellant has not served or filed his notice of appeal within ten days after imposition of the sentence; accordingly, this appeal is dismissed.¹ *See Hill v. S.C. Dep't of Health & Env'tl. Control*, 389 S.C. 1, 21, 698 S.E.2d 612, 623 (2010) ("The service of a notice of appeal is a jurisdictional requirement, and the time for service may not be extended by this Court."). Remittitur will be sent according to Rule 221(b), SCACR.
