ORDER

This appeal arises out of a ruling on a pretrial discovery matter. The appeal is dismissed as not immediately appealable. *See Ex parte Wilson*, 367 S.C. 7, 13, 625 S.E.2d 205, 208 (2005) (noting a discovery order is not a final order pursuant to S.C. Code Ann. §14-3-330 (2017) because it leaves some further act to be done by the court before the rights of the parties are determined); *Grosshuesch v. Cramer*, 377 S.C. 12, 30, 659 S.E.2d 112, 122 (2008) ("[D]iscovery orders, in general, are interlocutory and are not immediately appealable because they do not, within the meaning of the appealability statute, involve the merits of the action or affect a substantial right."); *Hamm v. S.C. Pub. Serv. Comm'n*, 312 S.C. 238, 241, 439 S.E.2d 852, 853 (1994) (holding discovery orders are interlocutory and not immediately appealable). The remittitur will be sent as provided by Rule 221(b), SCACR.
