To Whom It May Concern,

On October 7, 2025, I filed the instant appeal, No. 2025-002050, against the Respondents/Appellants, Richard and Walter Lewis. On January 12, 2026, I filed my initial brief in this case, along with the Designation of Matter to be Included in the Record on Appeal.

In the meantime, on December 2, 2025, Respondents/Appellants filed their own notice of appeal, No. 25-002400, on a different matter within the case.

On January 21, 2026, the Court consolidated these two appellate cases for consideration by this Court.

Although I moved to dismiss this second appeal by Respondents/Appellants as untimely, the Court denied the Motion to Dismiss on April 1, 2026. Within the order from the Court denying the motion to dismiss, the Court stated the following: "Appellant/Respondent shall serve and file Appellant's Initial Brief and Designation of Matter within twenty days of the date of this order."


As I interpreted this Order, I believed that the Court was telling to file the initial brief and designation of matter by April 21, 2026. This confused me, however, as I have already filed both of these documents. My initial brief focused on the issues involved with my appeal. Once the Respondents/Appellants file their brief and raise their own issues, I will respond to those in my Reply Brief.

On April 2, 2026, I filed a motion with this Court, seeking clarification on the exact documents that must be filed by April 21, 2026, considering I have already filed both of the documents requested by the Court's Order. I have not yet heard back from the Court, and the deadline is quickly approaching.

I am writing this letter, seeking immediate clarification as to what exactly I should be filing with the Court by April 21, 2026.
