ORDER

This appeal arises out of an order of the circuit court affirming the magistrate's decision regarding the installation of flooring in Appellant's home. The appeal is currently held in abeyance to allow the Court time to consider numerous motions filed by Appellant.

On January 28, 2026, Appellant filed a motion seeking a 30-day extension of time to file an amended initial brief and designation of matter. The motion is granted and Appellant's amended initial brief and designation of matter filed on February 12, 2026, are accepted as filed.

On February 3, 2026, Appellant also filed a motion seeking permission to supplement the record on appeal with a transcript of audio from videos submitted into evidence. The videos were provided to the Court on December 1, 2025, for consideration as part of the record on appeal. After careful consideration, the motion to transcribe the videos is denied.¹ To the extent Appellant wishes to supplement the record with matters not presented below, the motion is denied.

¹ On February 23, 2026, Appellant filed a motion to supplement her motion for an extension of time to file an amended initial brief and designation of matter and to supplement her motion seeking permission to supplement the record. Appellant filed another motion on April 6, 2026, with additional supplemental material regarding the January 28 and February 3 motions. The motions to supplement are granted, and the supplemental material was considered as a part of the January 28 and February 3 motions.

On February 27, 2026, Appellant filed a document entitled "Appellant's Notice of Extraordinary Interference and Witness Tampering" regarding her medical chart at McLeod Health. We decline to take action on this notice because it does not meet the requirements of Rule 240, SCACR.

On March 31, 2026, Appellant requested instructions regarding the submission of the record on appeal. On April 9, 2026, she filed the record on appeal. On April 10, 2026, she filed the appellant's final brief and another copy of the record on appeal. Now is not the time for filing the record on appeal and final brief because Respondents have not had an opportunity to serve and file their initial brief and designation of matter. We are returning the record on appeal and Appellant's final brief as prematurely filed.


On April 6, 2026, Appellant filed a motion to exceed page limits. We decline to rehear this motion pursuant to Rule 221(c), SCACR, because the Court issued an order denying Appellant's motion to exceed page limits on August 18, 2025.

On April 7, 2026, Appellant filed a motion to correct docket entries in this matter. After careful consideration, this motion is granted, and the relevant docket entries have been updated.

On April 8, 2026, Appellant filed a motion pursuant to the Americans with Disabilities Act seeking an extension of time to perfect her appeal due to the number of pending motions in this case. This motion is granted, and as noted above, Appellant's amended initial brief and designation of matter filed on February 12, 2026, are accepted as filed.

At this time, Respondents have 30 days from the date of this order to serve and file their initial brief and designation of matter. If Respondents choose not to file a brief, the Court will send another letter setting the next timeline for perfecting the appeal.

We take this opportunity to caution Appellant that the Court may decide to impose sanctions pursuant to Rule 269, SCACR, up to and including the refusal to accept any further filings without the signature of an attorney, if she continues to file frivolous motions when the same or similar motions are already pending review.
