APPELLANT'S MOTION TO CORRECT OR MODIFY THE RECORD ON APPEAL

COMES NOW, the Appellant, Rodney White, pro se, and respectfully moves this Honorable Court to Correct or Modify the Record on Appeal pursuant to Rule 210, SCACR, and shows this Honorable Court the following:

1. THE RECORD ON APPEAL CONTAINS MATERIALS OUTSIDE THE TRIAL COURT RECORD

The Record on Appeal must be limited to materials that were presented to and considered by the trial court at the time of its ruling.

Upon review, Appellant has identified materials included in the Record that were not filed, admitted, or considered by the trial court and therefore fall outside the proper scope of appellate review.

2. EMAIL CORRESPONDENCE (PAGES 105–113) IS NOT PART OF THE RECORD

Pages 105 through 113 of the Record on Appeal consist of email correspondence.

These materials:

- Were not filed with the trial court;
- Were not admitted into evidence;
- Were not part of any hearing or ruling;

and therefore do not properly constitute part of the Record on Appeal.

3. POST-JUDGMENT FILINGS AND COLLATERAL PROCEEDINGS (PAGES 360–375) ARE OUTSIDE THE RECORD

Pages 360 through 375, identified as:

- Section IX – Post-Judgment Filings; and
- Section X – Collateral Proceedings,

reflect events that:

- Occurred after entry of the final order;
- Arose during the pendency of this appeal;
- Were not before the trial court at the time of its ruling;

and therefore fall outside the proper scope of the Record on Appeal.

4. CORRECTION OF THE RECORD IS NECESSARY TO ENSURE COMPLIANCE WITH APPELLATE RULES

Inclusion of materials outside the record creates unnecessary procedural issues and risks diverting attention from the merits of this appeal.

Appellant does not intend to rely on any materials outside the official record and seeks to ensure full compliance with the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules.

**5. THIS REQUEST IS MADE IN GOOD FAITH AND DOES NOT PREJUDICE
RESPONDENT**

This Motion is made in good faith and not for purposes of delay.

Correction of the Record will:

- Promote accuracy in appellate review;
- Prevent procedural disputes; and
- Ensure this Court considers only proper materials.

No prejudice will result to the Respondent.

CONCLUSION

The Record on Appeal must reflect only what was before the trial court.


Materials outside that record should not be included or considered.

WHEREFORE, Appellant respectfully requests that this Court:

- Strike or disregard pages 105 through 113;
- Strike or disregard pages 360 through 375 (Sections IX and X);
- Confirm that the Record on Appeal consists only of materials properly before the trial court; and
- Grant such other and further relief as this Court deems just and proper.
