

## ORDER

---

This appeal arises out of the circuit court's order affirming Appellant's magistrate court conviction for breach of the peace. Appellant received written notice of entry of the order of the circuit court on February 12, 2026. Appellant did not provide proof of timely service on Respondent.<sup>1</sup> Accordingly, the appeal is dismissed. *See Elam v. S.C. Dep't of Transp.*, 361 S.C. 9, 14-15, 602 S.E.2d 772, 775 (2004) ("The requirement of service of the notice of appeal is jurisdictional, *i.e.*, if a party misses the deadline, the appellate court lacks jurisdiction to consider the appeal. . . ."). The remittitur will be sent as provided by Rule 221(b), SCACR.

Regardless of any confusion over the appropriate party to name as Respondent in this Court, Appellant has failed to show proof of timely service on any party pursuant to Rule 203(b)(1), SCACR.
