**CONSENT MOTION FOR SECOND
EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE INITIAL BRIEF**

Appellant Coley Frank Adams hereby respectfully requests a second enlargement of time by thirty (30) days in which to file his initial brief in this matter, until June 19, 2026. The basis for this motion is as follows:

1. This is an appeal from the South Carolina Administrative Law Court concerning the South Carolina Department of Revenue's denial of Respondent MPC Harden, LLC's liquor-by-the-drink license and the ALC's subsequent decision to grant Respondent's license pursuant to certain conditions. Appellant, who was an intervenor in the proceedings below, appealed from the ALC's Final Order and Order Denying Motion for Reconsideration on March 20, 2026. In his notice of appeal, Appellant stated that no additional transcripts were necessary for this appeal,

because Appellant had already ordered and obtained the transcripts necessary for the prosecution of this appeal. Thus, Appellant's initial brief was originally due on April 20, 2026.

2. On April 14, 2026, Appellant sought a first extension of time to file his initial brief in this matter. Appellant informed the Court that counsel's prior and ongoing obligations had hampered his ability to complete Appellant's initial brief, and therefore requested an enlargement of time by 30 days in which to complete and submit that brief. On April 23, 2026, the Court granted that request, making Appellant's initial brief due on May 20, 2026.

3. Since that time, Appellant has been working diligently to complete his initial brief in this matter, but counsel's ongoing obligations in other cases have continued to hinder his ability to complete that briefing. Appellant therefore respectfully requests a second enlargement of time by thirty (30) days in which to file his initial brief and designation of matter in this appeal.

4. The undersigned counsel has conferred with counsel for both Respondents concerning this request. Both Respondents MPC Harden and S.C. Department of Revenue consent to the relief requested herein.

WHEREFORE, Appellant respectfully requests an additional thirty (30) days, up to and including June 19, 2026, in which to file his initial brief in this matter.
