Dear Ms. Allen:

I am in receipt of your correspondence dated December 11, 2013, and providing the requested items.

The verbal instructions from the Circuit Judge provided ten (10) days from the hearing to comply with the Order, which was not received more than three weeks after the hearing or filed with the Clerk for more than thirty (30) days. Less than fourteen (14) days from the verbal order by the Court, Plaintiff's counsel moved to compel compliance and seeking penalties and Sheriff's assistance for failure to comply with the Court's instructions despite the fact such was not a signed Final Order.


Whereas Rule 203(b)(1), SCRPC, provides "A notice of appeal shall be served on all respondents within thirty (30) days after receipt of written notice of entry of the order or judgment" and such was complied with the Federal court is permitting leave to amend that complaint for violation of civil rights to include and address the premature dismissal by the Court of Appeals.

While Rule 203(b)(1), SCRPC, goes on to provide "When a form or other short order or judgment indicates that a more full and complete order or judgment is to follow, a party need not appeal until receipt of written notice of entry of the more complete order or judgment[.]" and the Court sua sponte dismissed the appeal at bar for failure to provide such Order, which was not made available for more than thirty (30) days following the hearing, there was no choice but to result to a jurisdiction with supersedas to the State to address the Plaintiff's lack of Standing, unlawful Order, and the attempt to enforce something not even filed.

Accordingly, please be advised that some aspects of this appeal have already been summarily previewed for Federal jurisdiction and granted leave for amendment to be included on the full complaint for violation of civil rights with the Circuit Judiciary's actions in failure to determine standing consistent with United States Supreme Court and South Carolina Supreme Court precedents.


