**PLAINTIFFS’ MOTION FOR LEAVE TO FILE MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME
TO FILE FINAL BRIEF ON CERTIFIED QUESTIONS AND
MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO MOVE FOR ADMISSION PRO HAC VICE**

Pursuant to Rule 263(b), SCACR, Plaintiffs Shannon Dunn, Theresa McGrier, Ricky Chase, Norman Black, Lataveia Allen, Ge-Quoia Whitfield, and Rosemary Ortiz, by and through the undersigned counsel, respectfully request leave to file a Motion for Extension of Time to File Final Brief on Certified Questions and a Motion for Extension of Time to Move for Admission Pro Hac Vice out of time, as the deadlines for these events has passed.

Specifically, Plaintiffs seek leave to file a motion requesting a 30-day extension of the May 22, 2026 deadline by which Plaintiffs must serve their Final Brief on Certified Questions under Rule 244(e), SCACR, and a motion requesting a 30-day extension of the May 7, 2026 deadline by which Plaintiffs must move for admission pro hac vice under Rule 244(d), SCACR.

The basis for this request is that an inadvertent calendaring error prevented Plaintiffs from moving to extend these deadlines prior to when they passed and failing to allow Plaintiffs to extend these deadlines would prevent a full decision on the merits of the certified questions. This is Plaintiffs' first request for an extension of these deadlines, and counsel for Defendant consents to this request.

Accordingly, for good cause shown, Plaintiffs respectfully request leave to file a Motion for Extension of Time to File Final Brief on Certified Questions and a Motion for Extension of Time to Move for Admission Pro Hac Vice out of time, as the deadlines for these events has passed.
