



ORDER

On June 2, 2026, this court dismissed the appeal on the basis Appellant had failed to provide proof of filing the notice of appeal with the circuit court clerk and a sufficient guilty plea explanation as required by Rule 203 of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules and this court's April 30, 2026 letter. The order also stated Appellant's counsel had failed to forward his guilty plea explanation and guilty plea explanation letter to his client. That same day, Appellant's counsel emailed this court, objecting to the dismissal order; we construe this email as a petition to rehear the dismissal. Attached to the email was a guilty plea explanation letter dated April 30, 2026, proof of filing with the circuit court clerk of court, and a guilty plea explanation from counsel. This court has received no guilty plea explanation from Appellant. After careful consideration, we deny the petition for rehearing on the basis Appellant has failed to provide a *sufficient* explanation as required by Rule 203(d)(1)(B)(iv) of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR).
