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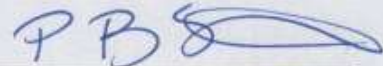

RULE 203(B) EXPLANATION

South Carolina*, 430 F.3d 696, 706 (4th Cir.2005) ("A defendant has a right to pursue a direct appeal, even if frivolous, which counsel must assist as 'an active advocate on behalf of his client.'") (Quoting *Anders v. California*, 386 U.S. 738, 744 (1967)).
