petition to be relieved as counsel.

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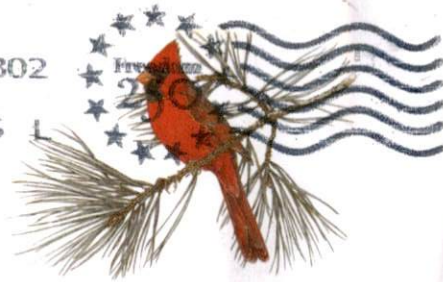

On January 14, 2026 counsel Ashley A. McManis
a Johnson's brief and a motion to be relieved as counsel

response to the Johnson's brief) and any other filings
