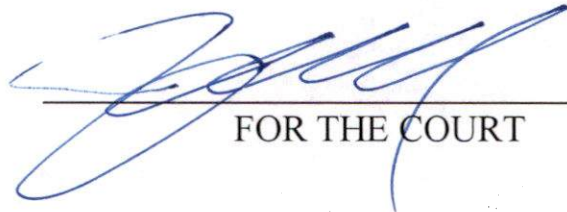

ORDER

On March 11, 2026, Appellant filed a notice of appeal from a circuit court order granting Respondent's motion to dismiss Appellant's complaint, which contained allegations related to a separate foreclosure and sale action initiated by Respondent. Appellant filed two motions with her notice of appeal: a motion to proceed *in forma pauperis* and a motion to dismiss Respondent's order, which appears to be requesting this court reverse or vacate the order on appeal. On March 31, 2026, Appellant filed another motion, arguing the mortgages Respondent used to foreclose on her home were fraudulent. Respondent did not file any returns.

After careful consideration, the motion to proceed *in forma pauperis* is denied pursuant to *Ex parte Martin*, 321 S.C. 533, 471 S.E.2d 134 (1995). The filing fee must be paid within fifteen days of the date of this order. Further, as to the March 11, 2026 and March 31, 2026 motions, to the extent Appellant seeks a ruling on the merits prior to briefing, those requests are denied.
