MOTION TO UNSEAL

Motion to unseal the accident report and all reports from the South Carolina Department of Motor Vehicle and the Highway Patrol records dated November 29, 2020. The seal records will be evidence to suggest the extent of details to the accident that the deceased claimant was in. I would like to also include Motion to unseal Emergency 911 calls, EMS reports, All Hospital Reports pertaining to Bernard Bluefort the decent on the date of November 28-November 30, 2020. These reports are sufficient evidence to support that the deceased claimant was in an accident on November 29, 2020 and that he sustained injuries from the accident and ultimately succumbed to the injuries sustained on the day of the accident. I would also like to Motion to unseal the court entire rehearing and hearing transcript, audio recording as well as video recordings dated January 9, 2025 that was transcribed in The South Carolina Worker's Compensation Dorchester County Court House 5200 East Jim Bilton Blvd, St. George, South Carolina, 29477 in Jury Assembly Room. Ann Vetach Noonan the testimony of Ann V. Noonan is sufficient evidence to prove beyond a reasonable doubt that the claimant died the day of the accident November 29, 2020. Also The Honorable Judge Scott T. Beck's statement to Ann V. Noonan will suggest that beyond a reasonable doubt that the testimony given by her the claimant can use it against her as evidence. Motion to request the unseal video, audio, and all transcripts that are sealed for the Hearing dated April 30, 2025 to the Worker's Compensation. The hearing will be sufficient evidence that the evidence that the claimant's widow and the claimant's daughter testimony was not transcribed accurately and that a lot of the testimony was omitted. Unsealing will prove as sufficient evidence to prove that the claimant's heart attack resulted from the injuries sustained from the accident and that the claimant's widow to support that the claimant's widow did not find out that the claimant died the day of the accident until January 9, 2025 which will suggest that the statute of limitation and the cause of death will suggest that this death claim is compensable due to the nature of the claimant's death.
