CHRONOLOGY OF EVENTS AND NOTICE OF RECEIPT OF DISPOSITION ORDER

April 23, 2026

Notice of Appeal filings entered with the South Carolina Court of Appeals.

June 22, 2026

Court of Appeals docket reflects entry of Disposition Decision - Order.

June 23, 2026

Petition for Rehearing documentation reflects filing/stamp date.

June 25, 2026

Appellant contacted the South Carolina Court of Appeals by telephone due to concern regarding the lack of response and the continued need for an appellate case number. Appellant requested clarification regarding the delay and sought information necessary to properly proceed with the appeal. At that time, Appellant had not received the dismissal order by mail.

June 25, 2026

Appellant served Petition for Rehearing and related documents upon required parties, including by certified mail, with proof of service documentation.

June 26, 2026

Appellant received the dismissal/disposition order by regular U.S. Mail. This was the first date Appellant became aware of the dismissal issue through receipt of the mailed order.

June 26, 2026

Appellant emailed the Court of Appeals Filings Office with attached documentation regarding the matter. Email records reflect the date and time of submission.
