ORDER

On March 11, 2026, Appellant filed a notice of appeal and proof of service indicating the State had been served on March 5, 2026. This court sent a deficiency letter explaining, among other things, that the notice of appeal was not accompanied by a redacted copy of the order/and or sentencing sheets challenged on appeal nor did it include a statement of when Appellant received written notice of entry of the order or judgment from which the appeal was taken. Appellant later provided sentencing sheets showing he pled guilty on February 3, 2026.

After careful consideration, the appeal is dismissed because Appellant failed to timely serve the notice of appeal on Respondent. *See* Rule 203(b)(2), SCACR ("After a plea or trial resulting in conviction or a proceeding resulting in revocation of probation, a notice of appeal shall be served on all respondents within ten (10) days after the sentence is imposed."). Remittitur will be sent in accordance with Rule 221(b) of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules.
