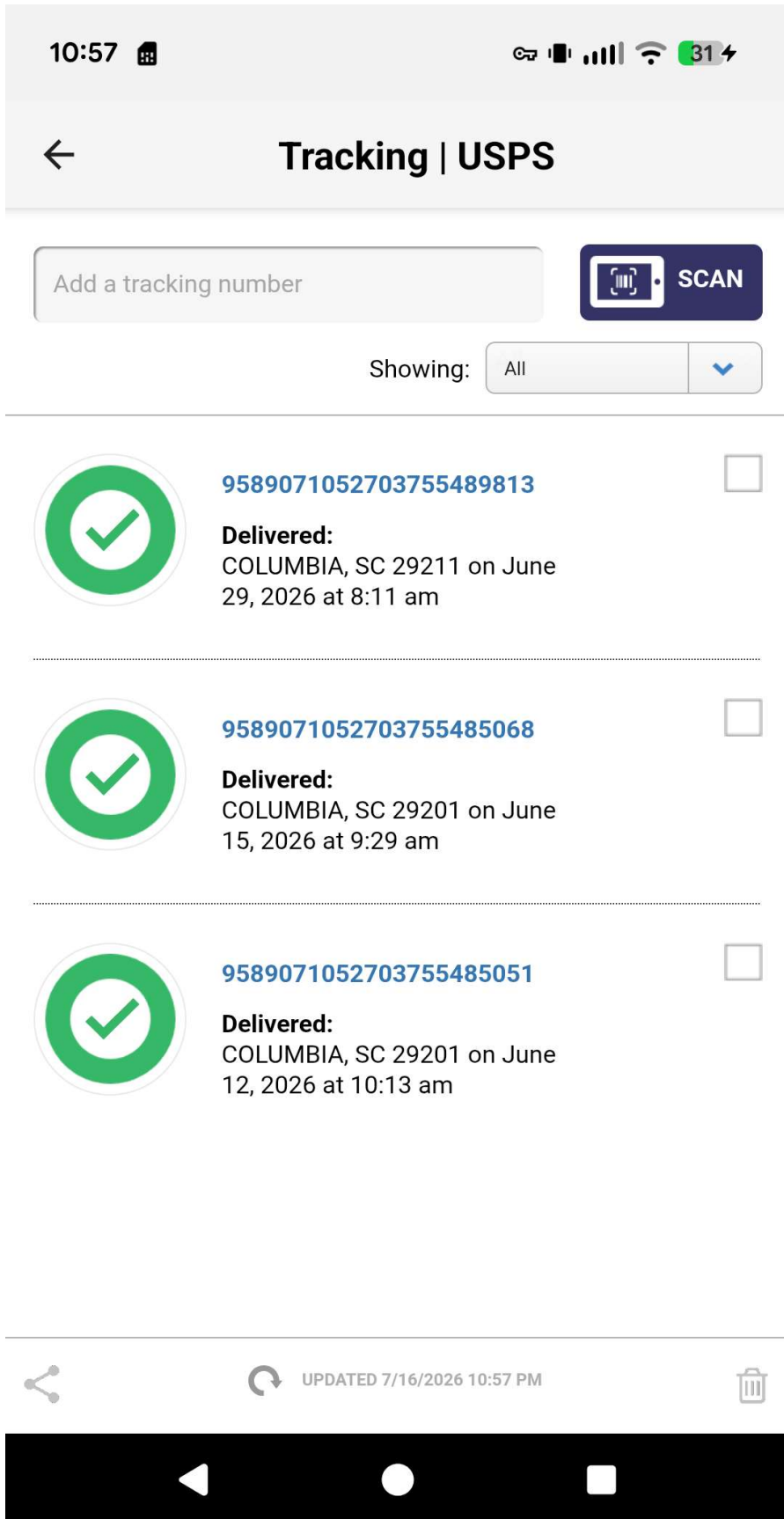

Statement Regarding Wrongful Shoplifting Allegation and Arrest

To Whom It May Concern,

I am writing to state that I deny the allegation that I committed shoplifting. At no time did I intend to steal any merchandise. My intent was to purchase the items I had selected, and I repeatedly offered to pay for them.

I was refused and denied the opportunity to complete my purchase, despite my willingness and ability to pay. I was never given a fair opportunity to lawfully purchase the merchandise before the situation escalated. My conduct was calm and cooperative, and it was not my behavior that was disruptive or caused the incident to escalate. I did not threaten anyone, create a disturbance, or refuse to cooperate. My only objective was to purchase my items and leave peacefully.

I walked out with the items openly and in plain view. I made no attempt to conceal the merchandise, flee the area, or evade anyone. My conduct was consistent with someone who intended to resolve the situation, not someone attempting to commit theft.

The beverages were in my backpack because I was traveling on foot and had to carry my belongings with me. I contend that the store clerks, store management, and responding police officers falsely portrayed the presence of the beverages in my backpack as evidence of shoplifting. In my view, this ignored the fact that I was simply carrying my belongings while walking and that I had every intention of paying for the merchandise.

When law enforcement became involved, I believed the responding officer would fairly investigate the situation and help resolve the dispute. Rather than running away or hiding, I remained available because I expected an impartial assessment of the facts. I believed the misunderstanding could be resolved once it was clear that I was willing and ready to pay for the merchandise.

I contend that false statements were made about my actions, resulting in my arrest. From my perspective, I was the person attempting to resolve the matter peacefully by offering payment, yet I was treated as though I had committed a crime. Had my intent been to steal, I could have fled or attempted to avoid law enforcement. Instead, I remained because I believed the officers would conduct a fair investigation and resolve the matter based on the facts.

I respectfully request that this incident be reviewed in its entirety, including all surveillance video, body-worn camera footage, witness statements, and any other available evidence that may demonstrate that I was denied the opportunity to purchase the merchandise, that I intended to pay for it, and that I lacked any intent to commit theft.

Statement Regarding Denial of Purchase
