Dear Clerk of Court:

I respectfully submit this letter concerning my Amended Record on Appeal and corrected Final Brief of Appellant.

On June 9, 2026, I filed a Record on Appeal and a Final Brief. On July 15, 2026, I received a letter from the Court dated July 13, 2026, identifying deficiencies in the Record on Appeal. The letter explained that:

1. The caption and title did not comply with Rule 267(a), SCACR;
2. The Record on Appeal was not in the proper format and did not contain an index as required by Rule 210, SCACR;
3. The front cover contained information beyond the caption permitted by Rule 267, SCACR; and
4. The Record on Appeal did not contain the required signature.

Those deficiencies have been addressed. I am now submitting a corrected and completed Amended Record on Appeal.

Respondent's designation of matter for inclusion in the Record was extensive. Because I am incarcerated and do not have internet access to the Public Index, I had to rely on others to obtain the additional documents filed in the lower court and referenced in Respondent's designation. As a result, the completed Amended Record contains substantially more pages than the Record originally filed.

Because the pagination and corresponding record references have changed, I also respectfully submit a corrected Final Brief of Appellant that updates the citations to the completed Amended Record on Appeal. The corrected Final Brief is intended to reflect the updated page numbers and record references without changing the substance of the appeal.

To the extent the Court's permission is required to accept the corrected Final Brief, I respectfully request leave to file it together with the Amended Record on Appeal.

I sincerely appreciate the Court's patience and consideration. Proceeding while incarcerated, without the financial ability to retain counsel and without legal training, has made this appellate process particularly demanding. Nevertheless, I have made every effort to comply with the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules and the deadlines established by the Court.

I would especially like to thank the case manager who answered my calls and responded promptly to my questions; the Clerk's Office for its patience and timely assistance; and the Spartanburg County Detention Center, particularly Deputy Mevedev, who was extremely accommodating and helped arrange for a tablet to be assigned to me so that I could conduct legal research and complete the demanding task of preparing this appellate filing.

I also respectfully thank Respondent's counsel, Ms. Sarah Timmons, for her professionalism, courtesy, and patience throughout this process. I am grateful to this Honorable Court for taking the time to review the parties' positions and consider this appeal.

Finally, I wish to thank my wife for her unwavering support and hard work, and for serving as my taskmaster and timekeeper so that I could meet the deadlines established by the Rules and the Court.

I am eternally grateful for everyone's patience, assistance, and consideration.
