APPELLANT'S NOTICE OF COMPLIANCE AND RE-SERVICE OF INITIAL BRIEF

Appellant Cheryl Carter, proceeding pro se, respectfully files this Notice to address, on an immediate basis, the transcript-status and service concerns raised in Respondent's Motion to Dismiss Appeal, or in the Alternative, for Sanctions and to Compel Compliance, while Appellant's substantive opposition to that motion is prepared and filed separately.

1. Transcript Status

Appellant has diligently pursued the transcript(s) needed for this appeal since shortly after filing her Notice of Appeal, ordering transcripts on multiple occasions between February and May

2026. The transcripts that exist and are relevant to this appeal are reflected in Appellant's Designation of Matter, filed July 22, 2026.

With respect to the transcript of the August 12, 2025 hearing (Transcript Request ID 142497386), Appellant has now confirmed, after sustained effort, that no such transcript exists. Upon ordering this transcript, Appellant received an out-of-office reply from the court reporter. Upon the reporter's stated return date, Appellant attempted to follow up and was informed that, due to the reporter's backlog, the matter would be assigned to a co-worker; Appellant was never contacted by that co-worker. This is what prompted Appellant's Notice Regarding Status of Transcript Request, filed with the Clerk on June 8, 2026, to which the Court did not respond. Appellant made a further attempt to contact the court reporter and received a written response, attached to this Notice as **Exhibit B**, confirming the Appellant's efforts to obtain the record of a transcript for the August 12, 2025 hearing.

Appellant's further inquiry, corroborated by the record of the Court of Common Pleas, established the reason: Respondent's counsel had filed a Motion for Leave due to a death in counsel's immediate family, which the Order of Protection was granted the day before the August 12, 2025 hearing. The Honorable Judge McCutchen, who presided at that hearing, confirmed this to Appellant directly. Because no transcript of that hearing exists, and because it is not necessary to the issues on appeal, Appellant did not include it in her Designation of Matter, consistent with Rule 209(b), SCACR, which limits a designation to matter relevant to the appeal.

This Notice, together with the record already on file, constitutes Appellant's current and complete status update regarding all transcripts in this matter.

2. Re-Service of Initial Brief

On July 10, 2026, the Clerk sent Appellant a letter addressing transcript status and noting that the Court had not yet received Appellant's Initial Brief. Appellant responded within two to three days by mailing the Initial Brief to Respondent's counsel on July 12, 2026 and to the Court on July 13, 2026.

Appellant served the Initial Brief on Respondent's counsel by U.S. Mail, first-class postage prepaid, on July 12, 2026. Appellant's Certificate of Service, filed with the Initial Brief, certifies that she served a true and correct copy of the brief on counsel for Respondent, Victoria W. Kurtz, Esq., by depositing it in the United States Mail, first-class postage prepaid, addressed to counsel at Johnston Law, LLC, 361 N. Shelmore Blvd., Mt. Pleasant, SC 29464. Under Rule 262(c)(2), SCACR, service by mail is complete upon mailing.

Appellant separately mailed a different copy of the Initial Brief to the Court of Appeals by UPS, with tracking, on July 13, 2026; the Court received and docketed that copy on July 15, 2026. To the extent Respondent's Motion refers to UPS tracking or delivery information addressed to the Court, that information relates to this separate mailing and does not appear in, or contradict, Appellant's Certificate of Service.

Since Respondent filed its Motion, Appellant has received back the envelope she mailed to Respondent's counsel on July 12, 2026, endorsed by the United States Postal Service "**Refused**" and returned to sender, attached to this Notice as **Exhibit A**. The envelope reflects that Appellant paid \$3.72 in postage at the time of mailing and that the Postal Service later reassessed the piece at \$4.18, a difference of \$0.46, which is the amount Respondent's employee was asked to pay and declined at Respondent's office on July 21, 2026. This is the same envelope described in

Respondent's Motion. The returned envelope, attached as **Exhibit A**, confirms that the Initial Brief was properly addressed to Respondent's counsel, mailed with postage paid in good faith, and tendered for delivery.

Without conceding any defect in her service on Respondent's counsel, which was already complete and effective under Rule 262(c)(2), SCACR, on July 12, 2026, Appellant is re-serving the Initial Brief on Respondent's counsel today by certified mail, return receipt requested and email with counsel's consent, solely to remove any further question on this point, as reflected in the certificate of service attached to this Notice. Appellant will provide proof of delivery to the Court upon receipt.

3. Ongoing Compliance

Appellant intends to continue copying Respondent's counsel, the Clerk of the Court of Appeals, and the Office of Court Administration on any further transcript-related correspondence, consistent with Rule 207(a)(1), SCACR, and will promptly notify the Court of any additional developments concerning the transcript(s) or the record on appeal.
