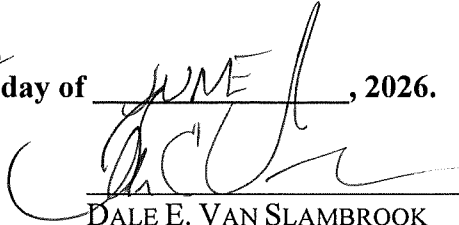

This matter is before the Court by way of an application for post-conviction relief (PCR) filed by Antonio Kinloch (Applicant) on October 5, 2020. Respondent filed a return and moved to summarily dismiss the application as successive and untimely. After reviewing the records, this court agreed this application should be summarily dismissed and provisionally dismissed the action by way of a Conditional Order of Dismissal filed on August 15, 2025, giving Applicant twenty days from the date of service of said Order to show why the dismissal should not become final. Attached to this Final Order and incorporated herein is a Certificate of Service showing Applicant was served the Conditional Order of Dismissal on March 9, 2026.

On July 22, 2025, Applicant filed a response to the Conditional Order of Dismissal with the Clerk of Court reiterating the facts he wrote in his application and amended applications. Applicant did not provide any legal arguments as to why his application should not be dismissed. Applicant has not set forth sufficient allegations to warrant an evidentiary hearing; thus, this Court finds this application should be dismissed.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that for the reasons set forth in the Court's Conditional Order of Dismissal, this application for PCR is hereby **DENIED AND DISMISSED WITH PREJUDICE**. Should Applicant wish to procure appellate review, he must file and serve a notice of appeal within thirty days of this Order. See Rule 203, SCACR. Applicant's attention is directed to Rule 243, SCACR, for the procedures following the filing and service of the notice of appeal.
