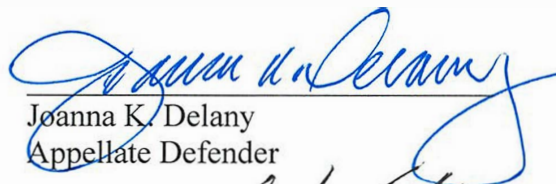

Counsel filed the Initial Brief of Appellant and Designation of Matter in the case of The State v. Virginia L. Driver with this Court on July 9, 2026. Counsel filed the Initial Brief of Appellant and Designation of Matter in the case of The State v. Dontrell L. Huff with this Court on July 2, 2026. Counsel filed the Petition for Writ of Certiorari to this Court and accompanying Appendix in the case of Herbert Holmes v. State with the Supreme Court on June 18, 2026.

3. This request is made in good faith, and not for purposes of delay. Counsel intends to continue to work on the cases with more than three extensions first so that the caseload will hopefully become more manageable in the near future, and less extensions will need to be requested.

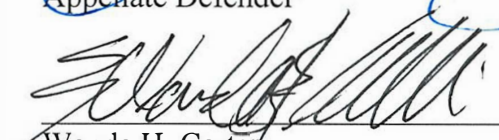

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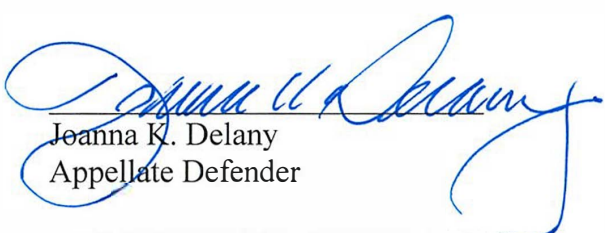
