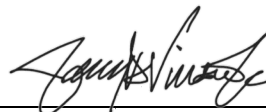

ORDER

Appellant filed a motion seeking an extension of time to serve and file the record on appeal. Appellant also seeks permission to include "clean copies of documents illegible within the public record." These requests are granted, with the direction that Appellant must provide the Court with copies of the illegible record immediately preceding the clean copies.

With regards to Appellant's request to serve only one of Respondent's attorneys, that request is denied. As set forth in the Supreme Court's April 24, 2024 order, a lawyer admitted to practice law in this state may serve a document on another lawyer using that lawyer's primary email address listed in the Attorney Information System (AIS). *See Re: Methods of Electronic Filing & Service Under Rule 262 of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (As Amended April 24, 2024)*, S.C. Sup. Ct. Order dated April 24, 2024 (Howard Adv. Sh. No. 15). Counsel for Respondent included their email addresses in their return. Appellant may serve a copy of the record on appeal on counsel for Respondent to their email addresses as set forth in Respondent's return and in AIS.

Appellant must serve and file a copy of the record on appeal within 30 days of the date of this order.
