Re: *Sabrina D Davis v. Bankers Life and Casualty Company*(26-1352)

Dear Judge Williams:

I am submitting this correspondence due to the newly issued decision made by this Court. I filed motions asking for an emergency ruling regarding the judgments issued in my case. I also asked the court to grant *in forma pauperis* regarding my appeal. Both of this motions were denied.

According to the US poverty guideline, I qualify for *in forma pauperis* status. The issues in this matter are very straight forward. The judgments issued by the Greenville Court of Common Pleas violate the law. The memorandum I supplied along with the motions stated that fact very clearly. The motion also addressed the “reasonable time” constraint established by the recent US Supreme Court ruling(See *Coney Island Auto Parts Unlimited, Inc. v. Burton*). I believe there are some silent issues of denied justice that are still occurring in my case against Bankers Life and Casualty Company. It should be noted that this Court issued their ruling in my first appeal when the statute of limitation had expired, which limited my option to refile the case. The matter in that appeal was not complex. This Court issued an arbitrary ruling that required less than a page, yet it took this Court 1 year and 10 months to issue a ruling. Combined with the improper dismissal that was granted and the void order issued by Judge Gravely, it is not spiteful to state that the courts are abusing their power to make a case go away. Turner and Padgett

moved too soon to have the case dismissed for insufficient process of service. I understand Turner and Padgett has a lot of connections to judges, however that connection does not give the courts the right to disregard laws, court rules, and case precedents to give this law firm an easy win.

Second, the Court of Common Pleas has deliberately issued a ruling that would have to be appealed. This court blindly issued a ruling without applying the guidelines of the US Supreme Court. In *Coney Island Auto Parts Unlimited, Inc. v. Burton* the Supreme Court ruled that motions to vacate void judgments must be filed within a reasonable time, however the Court stated motion to vacate a motion involving violations of due process was not restricted to time. Also the Supreme Court ruling does not address the situation of my particular situation. I filed a motion to vacate a void judgment, the judge issued an order that is completely void. I also asks that the actions of the Greenville Court of Common Pleas be taken under consideration. When I sought assistance to have the judgment enforced(both the district court and the appeals court have refused to acknowledge case# 2014CP2300815), the court declared that I had submitted fraudulent documents to the court. The courts have outright refused to honor laws and ignore the US Supreme Court because the matter is already decided in favor of Bankers Life and Casualty Company. I want the bias and discrimination investigated in this case because the courts can disregard and ignore any law, court procedure, court rule, and case precedent to keep an unjust ruling in place.
