Dear Ms. Smith:

I write in response to the Court's letter dated September 1, 2026, advising that two deficiencies remain outstanding with respect to a Motion to Allow Late Filing –and directing that they be corrected within ten (10) days of the date of that letter or the matter will be dismissed.

I want to be certain I am correcting the correct filing before that deadline passes. My own records do not clearly reflect the motion referenced in your letter, and I would like to confirm exactly what is on file before I resubmit anything, so that my correction addresses the actual deficiency and does not inadvertently introduce a new one. I do not recall filing a Motion to allow late filing.

I have in my records a stamped copy dated August 19, 2026, from the Court that was filed by Attorney Imhoff MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME OR ALLOW LATE FILING dated the 19th of August. However, because I want to be certain I am correcting the filing the Court has identified, I would appreciate the Court's guidance, or the request copies of my filings that are addressed in the Court's letter of September 1, 2026, as promptly as possible within that window.

If the Court is unable to provide them in time for me to respond by September 11, 2026, I respectfully request a brief additional period, limited to the time reasonably necessary after I receive the requested copies, and or guidance within which to file the correction.
