September 2, 2026 Eviction / Property-Removal Incident

**1. PURPOSE OF THIS REPORT**

This report documents concerns about the execution of an eviction/property-removal process on September 2, 2026, the removal of household belongings, property that is now missing, the whereabouts of a family cat, and available video, voicemail, screenshot, and witness evidence. The purpose is to request documentation and investigation of the missing property and animal and to preserve the available evidence.

**2. SUMMARY OF WHAT HAPPENED**

The household was not present at the residence when the writ was executed. At the time the property-removal activity occurred on September 2, 2026, the family was at the courthouse trying to address and resolve the ejectment matter. The family understood that they were supposed to have 48 hours to retrieve their belongings. The writ documents previously retained by the family state that the writ was posted on August 31, 2026 at approximately 9:02 a.m. and states that a deputy may enter after 24 hours. On September 2, doorbell-camera footage captured people at the property and activity involving boxes and other items.

Cornelius's sister — potential witness regarding events after the ejectment, including what she personally observed at the residence and the condition or handling of belongings after the property removal.

#### 4. WITNESSES / PEOPLE WITH POTENTIALLY RELEVANT INFORMATION

- Mario — the neighbor next door who reportedly witnessed the sheriff/deputy allow the landlord's people into the residence/property during the ejectment. A September 6, 2026 screenshot also shows a missed call from “Mario And Michelle Next Door,” and the user states that Mario made the call.
- Mario — the neighbor next door who reportedly witnessed the sheriff/deputy allow the landlord's people into the residence/property during the ejectment.
- Cornelius's sister — potential witness regarding events after the ejectment, including what she personally observed at the residence and the condition or handling of belongings after the property removal.

#### 5. AVAILABLE EVIDENCE

- Multiple September 2, 2026 doorbell-camera video clips from approximately 10:09 a.m. through 10:32 a.m., including clips showing activity at the residence and property removal.
- A September 2, 2026 administrative status filing to Sumter Summary Court documenting doorbell-camera activity at approximately 10:32–10:34 a.m.; the filing states that the person shown carrying/placing cardboard boxes could not be identified from the recording alone.
- Multiple Sheriff's Office voicemail recordings uploaded on September 6, 2026 and retained as part of the evidence set.
- September 6, 2026 screenshot showing the missed call from “Mario And Michelle Next Door.”
- The Writ of Ejectment and related court filings, including documentation that the writ was posted August 31, 2026 at approximately 9:02 a.m.

#### 6. REQUEST TO LAW ENFORCEMENT

Please document this incident and investigate the missing property and missing cat Astro. Please preserve and review the available doorbell footage, Sheriff's Office communications/voicemails, court documents, and witness information. Please document who was authorized to enter the residence, who entered, who removed or selected property, what property was removed, and whether any inventory or return procedure was used. Please also document Astro as a missing animal and disabled service animal and advise what additional information is needed to assist with locating him.

#### 7. DECLARATION

I am providing this report in good faith based on my recollection, the evidence in my possession, and information reported to me by witnesses. Where I cannot personally identify a person or establish who removed a particular item, I have intentionally stated that limitation rather than speculating.

#### **PROPERTY CONDITION / CONTAMINATION**

The family reports that spoiled food was thrown onto their belongings during the property-removal event. This is being documented as reported property contamination/damage. The affected belongings, extent of damage, and responsible person(s) should be identified through photographs, video, witness statements, and any available records. No person is identified as responsible in this report unless supported by evidence.

#### **FAMILY IMPACT / CONCERNS ABOUT THE MANNER OF THE REMOVAL**

The family is deeply disappointed and distraught about the way this matter was handled. From the family's perspective, the manner in which the property-removal process was carried out was extremely unprofessional and distressing. The family was at the courthouse attempting to address or resolve the ejectment matter and was not present at the residence to protect, supervise, or inventory its belongings. Learning that people were permitted to enter the residence and that belongings were subsequently missing has caused significant emotional distress, frustration, and concern, particularly because Astro, a male cat and service animal for a 14-year-old girl, is also missing. The family is requesting that these concerns be taken seriously and that the circumstances surrounding the entry, removal, handling, and disposition of the family's property be fully documented and reviewed.

#### **ADDITIONAL PROPERTY-REMOVAL OBSERVATION**

The family also wants the record to specifically reflect that the washer and dryer were not in the front yard after the property-removal activity. The family's brand-new Tide liquid laundry detergent was also not in the front yard. These items should therefore not be treated as property that was visibly left in the front yard for the family to retrieve. The family is requesting that the washer, dryer, and brand-new Tide liquid laundry detergent be accounted for as part of the property inventory and removal documentation.

#### **TELEVISION MOUNTS / WALL CONDITION**

The television wall mounts/brackets were left attached to the walls. The televisions themselves were removed, but the mounts remained installed on the walls. This should be documented as part of the condition of the residence and the property-removal record.

#### **ADDITIONAL MISSING ELECTRONICS**

Amazon Fire TV Stick devices and their associated remote controls are also missing following the September 2, 2026 property-removal event. These items should be included in the property inventory and accounting.

#### **ADDITIONAL MISSING ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT**

The Spectrum internet modem is also missing following the September 2, 2026 property-removal event. This should be included in the property inventory and accounting.
