ORDER

On May 28, 2026, Appellant filed a motion to remand or transfer this appeal to the court of common pleas. On June 2, 2026, Respondent filed a return, opposing the motion. Further, Respondent requested this court dismiss the appeal, arguing it was not timely served or filed. After careful consideration, we grant Appellant's motion to transfer this appeal to the court of common pleas. *See* S.C. Code Ann. § 62-1-308(a) (2002) (explaining "[a] person interested in a final order, sentence, or decree of a probate court may appeal to the circuit court in the same county"); S.C. Code Ann. § 62-1-308(l) (2002) ("If the parties not in default consent either in writing or on the record at a hearing in the probate court, a party to a final order, sentence, or decree of a probate court who considers himself injured by it may appeal directly to the Supreme Court . . ."); Rule 204(a), SCACR ("In the event that the notice of appeal is filed in the wrong appellate court, the appellate court in which the matter is filed shall issue an order transferring the case to the appropriate appellate court."); *In re Nov. 4, 2008 Bluffton Town Council Election*, 385 S.C. 632, 641, 686 S.E.2d 683, 688 (2009) (transferring an appeal to the proper forum). This court expresses no opinion on the timeliness of the appeal and leaves consideration of the timeliness of the appeal to the circuit court. Remittitur shall be sent in accordance with Rule 221(b) of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules.
