Dear Mr. Lisenby:

On June 7, 2013, the Court received a request from the appellant for a copy of the appellant's initial brief. On June 19, 2013, the Court responded to the request and informed the appellant that he must provide a money order or certified check in the amount of \$4.50, made payable to the South Carolina Court of Appeals. This amount represents the costs of copying and mailing 18 pages at a cost of twenty-five cents per page. On August 12, 2013, the Court received the appellant's second request for a copy of the appellant's initial brief. In his letter, the appellant states that he sent a money order for the copying costs. On August 21, 2013, the Court mailed the appellant a copy of the appellant's initial brief.

On September 6, 2013, the Court received a document entitled Amendment to Initial Brief of Appellant; however, the appellant did not include a motion asking the Court to accept this document for filing out of time. Accordingly, this document is returned to the appellant along with this letter. On October 17, 2013, and October 24, 2013, the Court received the appellant's third and fourth requests for a copy of his initial brief. We noted in our records that we sent another copy of the initial brief. On January 10, 2014, the Court received the appellant's fifth

request for a copy of his initial brief. Although our records indicate we have mailed the brief at least three times, we include a copy of the initial brief, along with the returned amended brief, for the final time along with this letter. The Court will not entertain any further requests for a copy of the appellant's initial brief absent extraordinary circumstances.
