ORDER

The respondent's initial brief and designation of matter were due to be served and filed on November 20, 2013. The respondent's brief and designation of matter were not served or filed as of that date. More than thirty days later, on December 30, 2013, counsel filed his first request for an extension of time. On January 30, 2014, counsel filed a second request for an extension of time. On January 31, 2014, the Court sent counsel a letter informing counsel that he must file a motion to serve and file the initial brief and designation of matter out of time. The letter also cautioned counsel that failure to do so would result in non-acceptance of the brief. Accordingly, the Court declines to consider respondent's motions and will proceed with consideration of the appeal without the respondent's initial brief and designation of matter.

The appellant is hereby instructed to serve the record on appeal in accordance with Rule 210 of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules within ten days of the date of this order.
