Must establish the defendant has a Full understanding of the consequences of his Plea and the Charges against him Boykin v Alabama 395 U.S. 283 89 S.Ct 1709 (1969)

Boykin the United State Supreme Court held that before a Court can accept a Guilty Plea a Criminal defendant must be advised of the Constitutional Right he is waiving specifically. the accused must be aware of the Privilege against self-incrimination the Right to a Jury trial and the Right to Confront ones accusers moreover a Criminal defendant entering a Guilty Plea must be aware of the nature and crucial element of the offense The maximum and any mandatory minimum Penalty and the nature of the Constitutional Right being waived Pittman v State 337 S.C. 597, 524 S.E. 2d 623 (1999). a Criminal defendant knowing and voluntary waiver of Statutory or Constitutional Right in a Guilty Plea must be established by a Complete Record Respect Fully Submitted

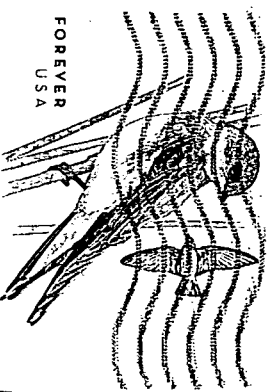

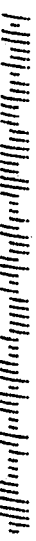
