

ORDER

Appellant requested two extensions of time in which to file its initial brief and designation of matter. The second order, which extended the time for filing to January 3, 2014, included the language "no further extensions will be granted absent extraordinary circumstances." On the due date, Appellant requested an additional ten days in which to file the initial brief and designation of matter. In the motion, counsel explained that the brief was completed, but due to the holiday season, he needed additional time to have the necessary copies printed and bound. The court received this extension request on January 8, 2014. In an order dated January 21, 2014, we noted our concern with what appeared to be an inadequate explanation of the extraordinary circumstances that would necessitate a third extension. Nevertheless, we informed Appellant we would consider a motion to file Appellant's initial brief and designation of matter out of time as long as it was received within fifteen days of the order. As of March 18, 2014, this court has not received Appellants initial brief and designation of matter. Accordingly, this appeal is dismissed.
