Pursuant to Rule 243(c) of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules: The Circuit Court's determination that Appellant's action is barred as being successive and/or untimely under the statute of limitations was improper. The Appellant relies upon the one-year discovery rule based upon his discovery that one of the jurors of the criminal trial was acquainted with the victim, but did not reveal that information during jury selection.
