Dear Counsel:

Our records reflect that you elected to change your membership status in the South Carolina Bar to retired member on March 6, 2014. According to Rule 410(h)(1)(G), SCACR, a retired member may not engage in the practice of law in South Carolina except as provided by Rule 410(q), SCACR. This section provides retired members may provide pro bono legal services if:

- (1) the member is associated with an approved legal services organization which receives, or is eligible to receive, funds from the Legal Services Corporation or is working on a case or project through the South Carolina Bar Pro Bono Program;
- (2) performs all pro bono legal services under the supervision of an attorney (Supervising Attorney) who is a regular member of the South Carolina Bar employed by, or participating as a volunteer for, the legal services organization or the South Carolina Bar Pro Bono Program and who assumes professional responsibility for the conduct of the matter, litigation, or administrative proceeding in which the attorney participates; and
- (3) neither asks for nor receives compensation of any kind for the legal services

provided to the client.

If you plan to continue your representation of the Aratas, please provide the court with proof that your representation meets the requirements Rule 410(q), SCACR, including the name of the Supervising Attorney. You must also provide the Court with a proof of service showing your clients' current address. The Court will take further action upon receipt of your response or upon the expiration of ten days, whichever is sooner.
