MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME
IN WHICH TO FILE THE
PETITION FOR WRIT OF CERTIORARI

Counsel respectfully requests a thirty day extension in which to file the petition for writ of certiorari in this case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. This is a second request for an extension. In support of this request, counsel shows:

1. The petition for writ of certiorari and appendix is due to be served and filed with the Court today.
2. Counsel respectfully submits that extraordinary circumstances exist which warrant the granting of an additional extension of time. Given the number of extensions previously granted

and the order in which counsel attempts to manage her caseload, counsel hopes that no further extension requests will be required.



On March 21, 2014, counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix and supplemental appendix in Henry Woods v. State with this Court. On March 20, 2014, counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Antjuan Tobias Greene v. State with this Court. On March 10, 2014, counsel filed an initial brief of appellant in State v. Leroy Clifton Gibbs with the Court of Appeals. On February 24, 2014, counsel filed an initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in State v. Michael Roscoe with the Court of Appeals. On February 20, 2014, counsel filed an initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in State v. Daniel Lopez with the Court of Appeals. On February 7, 2014, counsel filed a petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in Robert Lee Heydman v. State in this Court. On January 17, 2014, counsel filed an initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in State v. Jermel Rashond Daniels with the Court of Appeals.

4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay. Counsel intends to continue to work on the cases with more than three extensions first so that the caseload will hopefully become more manageable in the near future, and less extensions will need to be requested.

5. Counsel for the Attorney General's office has been informed of this request.

WHEREFORE, the undersigned counsel would respectfully request a thirty day extension in which to file the petition for writ of certiorari in this case based upon the above exigent circumstances.




