

Dear Ms. Kitchings:

The Defendant Jeffery Memering pled guilty under Alford on February 26, 2014 before the Honorable Kristi Lea Harrington. Mr. Memering pled at the close of the State's case in his trial for Breach of Trust with Fraudulent Intent. The issue arising from the Defendant, Jeffery Memering's plea, is whether the plea was entered voluntarily. Mr. Memering contends that his decision to plead guilty was influenced by the potential consequences his decision would have on his sentence, if convicted. Specifically, Mr. Memering contends that he pled guilty out of fear that he would be sentenced to prison if he did not plead guilty, and was subsequently found guilty by the jury. A timely motion to withdraw the plea was filed on March 5, 2014. Subsequently, the motion was heard by Judge Harrington on March 20, 2014. At the aforementioned hearing, Mr. Memering addressed the court in support of his motion. Judge Harrington denied the motion, and an appeal was filed on March 28, 2014.
