ORDER

Appellant has filed a notice of appeal from a judgment rendered by the magistrate's court. Pursuant to Rule 18 of the South Carolina Rules of Magistrates Court, Appellant must appeal any judgment rendered by the magistrates court to the circuit court of the county where the judgment was rendered. Accordingly, this case shall be transferred to the proper appellate court, the Court of Common Pleas. See Rule 204(a), SCACR ("In the event the notice of appeal is filed in the wrong appellate court, the appellate court in which the matter is filed shall issue an order transferring the case to the appropriate appellate court."); *In re November 4, 2008 Bluffton Town Council Election*, 385 S.C. 632, 641, 686 S.E.2d 683, 688 (2009) (invoking Rule 204(a) and transferring the case to the circuit court because it was the proper appellate forum).
