At a Court of General Sessions, convened on February 7, 2013 the Grand Jurors of
SUMTER County present upon their oath:

COUNT ONE**ARMED ROBBERY**

That **KEVIN T. CANTY, TYLOR D. FORD, FREDERICK A. GODBOLT, ABRAM GRANT and EMMANUEL M. PEARSON** did in Sumter County on or about July 25, 2011, feloniously take from Caleb Bass and Alexis Bass in their presence, by means of force or intimidation goods or monies of the said victims, such goods or monies being described: electronics, purses/wallets with credit cards, jewelry, cell phones, computer, video game consoles with controllers and game systems, while armed with a deadly weapon, to-wit: one of several weapons to include a AK47, .22 rifle, and a shotgun, all occurring at 114 Burkett Street, Sumter, South Carolina, in violation of Section 16-11-330 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina (1976), as amended.

COUNT TWO**KIDNAPPING**

That **KEVIN T. CANTY, TYLOR D. FORD, FREDERICK A. GODBOLT, ABRAM GRANT and EMMANUEL M. PEARSON** did in Sumter County on or about July 25, 2011, unlawfully seize, confine, inveigle, decoy, kidnap, abduct or carry away one Caleb Bass and Alexis Bass, without authority of law, in violation of Section 16-03-0910, S. C. Code of Laws, 1976, as amended.

COUNT THREE**CRIMINAL CONSPIRACY**

That **KEVIN T. CANTY, TYLOR D. FORD, FREDERICK A. GODBOLT, ABRAM GRANT and EMMANUEL M. PEARSON** did in Sumter County on or about July 25, 2011 combine with co-defendants, and/or with other persons, for the purpose of accomplishing a criminal or unlawful object or an object that is neither criminal nor unlawful through criminal or unlawful means, to wit: armed robbery, kidnapping and burglary-1st degree, in violation of Section 16-17-410, S. C. Code of Laws, 1976, as amended.

COUNT FOUR**POSSESSION OF A WEAPON DURING THE COMMISSION OF A VIOLENT CRIME**

That **KEVIN T. CANTY, TYLOR D. FORD, FREDERICK A. GODBOLT, ABRAM GRANT and EMMANUEL M. PEARSON** did in Sumter County, on or about July 25, 2011, possess a firearm, or visibly display what appeared to be a firearm, or visibly displayed a knife, during the commission or attempted commission of a violent crime, in violation of Section 16-23-0490, S. C. Code of Laws, 1976, as amended.

BURGLARY- 1ST DEGREE

That **KEVIN T. CANTY, TYLOR D. FORD, FREDERICK A. GOBOLT, ABRAM GRANT and EMMANUEL M.
