ORDER

On April 25, 2012, this Court dismissed Appellant's appeal for failure to provide proof that he served the Record on Appeal as required by Rule 210 of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules. Appellant has now filed a "Rule 59(e) Motion" and a "Rule 60(a) Motion," which we construe as a petition for rehearing. In his motions, Appellant indicates he provided proof of service on January 25, 2012. Our review of the record, however, indicates Appellant submitted proof that he served Appellant's Final Brief and Designation of Matter on January 25, 2012.

Within thirty days, Appellant shall prepare a Record on Appeal, which includes all matter designated by Appellant and Respondent, serve a copy of the Record on Appeal on Respondent, and provide this Court with proof of service. *See* Rule 210, SCACR. Upon receipt of the proof of service, or upon the expiration of thirty days, this Court will consider Appellant's petition for rehearing.
