These issues are now in a state writ of Habeas Corpus petition with the same issues. The state writ of Habeas Corpus petition has been before a Honorable Administrative Judge and the petitioner did not even get a chance to try to explain to the Honorable Administrative Judge things about the functions of this state writ of Habeas Corpus petition were about the "Right to Liberty" in my case and notwithstanding with the Criminal acts. It is no way the Honorable Administrative Judge could not had read this state writ of Habeas Corpus and did not see the "Rights to Liberty" violations. 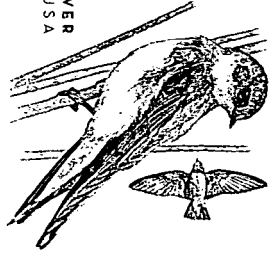
