Dear Mr. Brittain:

The Office of Bar Admissions has received your Verified Applications for Admission Pro Hac Vice on behalf of Jeffrey S. Cashdan and Zachary A. McEntyre and the accompanying \$500.00 filing fee in the above-captioned matter before the South Carolina Court of Appeals. For your information, effective May 14, 2014, the Supreme Court of South Carolina amended Rule 404, SCACR, to, among others, provide that "[i]f the motion to appear pro hac vice is granted [in the lower court], the authority to appear pro hac vice shall continue through the remainder of the action or proceeding, including any appellate proceedings, unless permission is withdrawn as provided in (h), below." Rule 404(c), SCACR.

Since it appears Mr. Cashdan and Mr. McEntyre's motion to be admitted pro hac vice were granted in the lower court, it is unnecessary for them to file Verified Applications for Admission Pro Hac Vice for appearance before the new tribunal. Within ten (10) days of the date of this letter, please provide the Clerk of the Court of Appeals with a copy of the lower court's order granting Mr. Cashdan and Mr. McEntyre's admission pro hac vice in this matter and with the name and South Carolina Bar Number of the associated regular member(s) of the South Carolina Bar. See Rule 404(c), SCACR.
