
1. The petition for writ of certiorari and appendix is due to be served and filed with the Court today, July 18, 2012.

On June 14, 2012, counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and appendix in Preston Costa v. State in this Court. On June 6, 2012, counsel had an oral argument in State v. Tremaine Rashon Wray in the Court of Appeals. On June 4, 2012 counsel had an oral argument in State v. Kasseem Stephens in the Court of Appeals. On June 1, 2012, counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in State v. Ashley Moore in the Court of Appeals.

4. Counsel makes this request in good faith and not for purpose of delay.
5. Counsel for the Attorney General's office has been informed of this request.

WHEREFORE, the undersigned counsel would respectfully request a thirty day extension, in which to file the petition for writ of certiorari and appendix in this case based upon the above exigent circumstances. 


