

ORDER

The parties in this cross-appeal have filed a joint motion requesting a sixty-day extension to file initial appellants' briefs and designations of matter. The parties also request permission for an extended briefing schedule.

Respondent-Appellant also requests permission to exceed the page limits set forth in Rule 208 of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules. Specifically, Respondent-Appellant requests permission to file an initial appellant's brief that does not exceed seventy-five pages, and Appellant-Respondent requests permission to file an initial respondent's brief that does not exceed seventy-five pages.

The motions for a sixty-day extension, an extended briefing schedule, and to exceed the page limit are granted. The parties shall serve and file their initial appellants' briefs by July 8, 2014. Initial respondents' briefs shall be due sixty days following the service of the last appellant's brief. Reply briefs shall be due thirty days following the service of the last respondent's brief.
