ORDER

Respondent has filed a motion to strike portions of Appellant's initial brief and designation of matter, arguing Appellant included documents and issues that were not before the circuit court, are not relevant, or are barred by the doctrine of res judicata. Respondent's motion is granted in part.

We strike numbers 2, 3, 6, 7, 9, and 10, from Appellant's designation of matter. We also strike Appellant's exhibits 1 and 2 from the designation of matter. Within thirty days, Appellant shall serve and file an amended designation of matter that excludes the stricken documents and an amended initial brief that excludes any reference to these documents. In the amended designation of matter, Appellant shall clearly identify the documents numbered 18 and 19 and shall not refer to the documents as "reserved." Respondent's motion is otherwise denied. Nothing in this order prevents Respondent from raising the issues of preservation and res judicata in its brief.

Appellant's motion to argue against precedent is denied.
