MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME  
IN WHICH TO FILE THE PETITION FOR WRIT OF  
CERTIORARI AND APPENDIX

Counsel for Dytavis Hinton respectfully requests an extension of thirty (30) days in which to file the petition for writ of certiorari and appendix in this case. 
