

ORDER

After the court granted three extension requests, Appellant's initial brief and designation of matter were due on June 4, 2014. The order granting the second and third extensions required a showing of "good cause" and "extraordinary circumstances," respectively, before an extension of time would be given. Counsel cited only to an unusually heavy workload. On June 3, 2014, the court received Appellant's motion for a fourth extension which explained that a training week with the Army National Guard necessitated the extension. We understand and appreciate counsel's commitment to the Army National Guard, however, because the motion itself states the training lasted only a week, we are concerned that counsel has not been able to complete his brief within the 120 days already allotted. Nevertheless, we grant Appellant's motion and extend the time for filing Appellant's initial brief and designation of matter to July 7, 2014.
