APPELLANTS MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME WITHIN WHICH
TO SERVE AND FILE APPELLANTS SECOND AMENDED INITIAL BRIEF

Appellant hereby moves this Court for (first) extension of time to file as ordered, second Amended Initial Brief of Appellant and Designation of Matter. In support of this motion, Appellant submits the following:

1. That Appellant received this Courts Order dated as filed 6/16/14 on 6/18/14 ordering Appellant to alter Amended Initial Brief of Appellant.
2. That in-part due to the SCDMH SVPTP prison unit that appellant is housed in, went on a medical lock down for 7 days and the extremely limited access to the units computers and printers is interfering with Appellants meaningful access to the courts, in order for Appellant to rewrite, edit and serve and file the ordered second amended initial brief on appeal.

3. It can be further shown, that due directly to this courts ordering appellant to amend his original amended initial brief on appeal, has caused hard ship in the form of having Appellant seek and attempt to locate legal reference that Appellant does not have access to or legal references that takes an inorian amount of time to locate and receive from out side sources.

Note: The SCDMH SVPTP unit does not have a legal reference library, such as that is provided to State convicted prisoners.

4. That Appellants only legal references are accessed through the U.S mail / through third parties who go on the inter-net, research free access legal reference webb sites, then if that third party does find the given subject matter, the third party then mails that information to Appellant. Then Appellant submits a SCDMH Request To Staff , requesting for the SCDMH Legal Counsel's staff Paralegal person to provide appellant with a copy of the requested legal reference material.


The above stated process on average takes 4-5 weeks, and it can be pointed out that this process may take months or even years in order to locate usable legal references.


