The matter went before The Aiken County GSC  
Court on A motion To Dismiss pursuant To The  
Interstate Agreement on Detainers Act And The And  
The order of June 24, 2013, denying Appellants  
motion For Reconsideration. Because Appellant  
Failed To timely serve The notice OF Appeal on  
Respondent As set Forth In Rule 203 (b)(2)  
OF The S.C.A.C.R.

The Appellant subsequently filed this appeal to the Administrative law court in an attempt to seek relief in the matter, the issues that are to be entertained are expressly stated herein to wit on March 28<sup>th</sup> 2014, Appellant filed a pro se notice of appeal from the circuit court's order of April 25<sup>th</sup>, 2013 denying Appellant's motion to dismiss pursuant to the Interstate Agreement on Detainers Act and the order of June 24<sup>th</sup>, 2013, denying Appellant's motion for reconsideration. Because Appellant allegedly failed to timely serve the notice of appeal on Respondent as set forth in Rule 203(b)(2) of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules the appeal was dismissed on June 16<sup>th</sup>, 2014. However, the Appellant argues that he shall enjoy the benefit of Houston v. Lack and that this court is in another jurisdiction therefore I shall enjoy the privilege to seek relief, the Appellant's arguments will be elucidated at the time of filing briefs pursuant to Rule # 60 (A) of the SCACR, the court erred in dismissing my appeal when (I) timely filed the initial notice of appeal. Thus violating my 14<sup>th</sup> Amend. Right to protection under the laws.
