Dear Mr. Mazyck:

This responds to your *pro se* petition for rehearing dated June 27, 2014, which was received today. Please be advised that no action will be taken on this petition for several reasons.

First, you are represented by counsel in this matter. Therefore, your *pro se* petition for rehearing cannot be accepted for filing. *Miller v. State*, 388 S.C. 347, 697 S.E.2d 527 (2010); *Jones v. State*, 348 S.C. 13, 558 S.E.2d 517 (2002); *State v. Stuckey*, 333 S.C. 56, 508 S.E.2d 564 (1998); *Foster v. State*, 298 S.C. 306, 379 S.E.2d 907 (1989).


Second, you have not provided a proof of service showing that a copy has been served on opposing counsel as required by Rule 240 of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR).

Third, since this matter was dismissed by order dated June 4, 2014, any petition for rehearing had to be actually received by this Court on or before June 19, 2014. Rule 221, South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR). Accordingly, your petition is untimely.

Finally, when no petition for rehearing was received within the time provided by Rule 221, SCACR, the remittitur was sent to the circuit court. The sending of the remittitur ended appellate jurisdiction over this case and no further motion or petition can be considered by this Court. *Wise v. South Carolina Department of Corrections*, 372 S.C. 173, 642 S.E.2d 551 (2007).

Therefore, no action will be taken on your *pro se* petition for rehearing.
