I have a step#2 Grievance Pending in regards to MS. Corporal M.C. JONES denying me legal supplies. It was filed this year.

She is still denying me a pen. The one I'm using now is one I had to ~~buy~~ purchase buy selling my food.

Ms. Jones told me that she doesn't care about the grievance, I filed nor what headquarters say. She said she's not scared of none of them. She said this on May 19th 2014.

Since I already informally resolved this issue, filed a step one & two grievance, what am I suppose to do now? Its against institutional rules to be selling my food for legal supplies and I had no other choice but to do it so I could meet my 5-27-14 court deadline which I showed her on 5-19-14.

I have over five different responses to request forms from her denying me legal pens. Under Lewis v. Casey 116 S.Ct. 2174, 2176 (1996) the length of denial has to exceed 16 days. And I have to show injury. Injury is me having to sell my food to buy this pen in order to meet my deadline.
