
Motion for an Extension of Time

Pursuant to Rules 208 and 240 of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules, Appellant Directory Assistants, Inc. moves this Court for an order granting a thirty (30) day extension of time to file its Initial Appellant's Brief and Designation of Matters in the above-captioned appeal. This is Appellant's second extension request. **Counsel for Respondent has consented to this extension request.** Thus, no party will be prejudiced by this extension.

The extension is necessitated due to other conflicting deadlines, work obligations, hearings, and previously scheduled court attendance, including advance preparation for same. Such conflicts prevent undersigned counsel from completing the Initial Appellant's Brief and Designation of Matters within the current deadline. 
