MOTION FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME  
IN WHICH TO FILE THE PETITION FOR WRIT OF  
CERTIORARI AND APPENDIX

Counsel for Jason Turmon respectfully requests a **final thirty (30) day extension, until September 10, 2014**, in which to file the petition for writ of certiorari and appendix in this case. This motion is made pursuant to the Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009. This is a third request for an extension. In support of this request, counsel shows:


and accompanying appendix in the case of Michael Maxwell v. State of South Carolina with this Court on June 9, 2014.

5. Counsel for the Attorney General's office consents to this request as shown by signature below.




